LABIOPLASTY

- 1. Always clean your hands before touching or caring for your wounds
- 2. For the first two days after surgery take 2 Panadol every six hours for pain relief. DO NOT TAKE ASPIRIN
- 3. Take frequent warm showers to reduce discomfort
- 4. Use a hairdryer on a low setting to dry the stitches after bathing, and try to keep the area as dry as possible
- 5. Change pads frequently
- 6. If there is excessive redness or irritation with your wound/s, or signs of infection, or if you develop a fever above 37.5°, please telephone our rooms on the numbers above. If you are unable to contact us at the rooms, please telephone the after hours number instead
